NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the New Mexico Department of Agriculture (NMDA), proposes to repeal and replace 21.18.4.1 et. seq. NMAC, SEED STANDARDS AND CLASSIFICATIONS.

PURPOSE AND SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSED RULES:

Primary proposed amendments to the current Seed Standards and Classifications rule language updates the fee schedule for testing seeds that support the state seed laboratory for analyzing samples submitted by constituents. The amendments update seed name and scientific names in the prohibited and restricted noxious weed seeds. Lastly, the rule amendments update the germination standards for vegetable seed and methods of sampling, inspecting, analyzing, testing and examination of seed by referencing the Federal Seed act 7 CFR part 201.

The departments obligation to the citizens of New Mexico is to assure that seeds sold in the state are labeled properly and meet the standards placed upon the label. The current fee schedule set in rule for seed testing by the department to recoup costs of testing and examine samples requested by outside persons or entities from the department.

Proposed rule changes will follow the repeal and replacement process rather than the amendment process for seed standards and classifications. These adjustments are necessary to help offset the increased cost seed testing and analysis for inflation and mandatory adjustments to staff salaries. The proposed changes also clean up the prohibited and noxious weed names and species as well as adopt the Federal Seed Act 7 CFR part 201 for methods of sampling and testing as well as germination standards which clean up the rule.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: Granted to the Board of Regents of New Mexico State University under the New Mexico Seed Law, Chapter 76, Article 10, Sections 11 through 22, New Mexico Statutes Annotated, 1978 Compilation.

POR EL PRESENTE ANUNCIO SE COMUNICA que el Departamento de Agricultura de Nuevo México (NMDA) propone derogar y reemplazar la sección 21.18.4.1 y siguientes del NMAC, ESTÁNDARES Y CLASIFICACIONES DE SEMILLAS.

PROPÓSITO Y RESUMEN DE LAS NORMAS PROPUESTAS:

Las principales enmiendas propuestas a la normativa actual sobre Estándares y Clasificaciones de Semillas actualizan el programa de tarifas para el análisis de semillas que apoya al laboratorio estatal de semillas en el análisis de las muestras presentadas por los ciudadanos. Las enmiendas actualizan el nombre y los nombres científicos de las semillas de malezas nocivas prohibidas y restringidas. Finalmente, las enmiendas a la normativa actualizan los estándares de germinación para semillas de hortalizas y los métodos de muestreo, inspección, análisis, prueba y examen de semillas, haciendo referencia a la Ley Federal de Semillas, Título 7 del Código de Reglamentos Federales, parte 201.

La obligación del departamento en nombre de los ciudadanos de Nuevo México es garantizar que las semillas vendidas en el estado estén correctamente etiquetadas y cumplan con los estándares establecidos en la etiqueta. El programa actual de tarifas establecido por el departamento para el análisis de semillas busca recuperar los costos de las pruebas y examinar las muestras solicitadas por personas o entidades externas.

Los cambios propuestos a la reglamentación seguirán el proceso de derogación y reemplazo, en lugar del proceso de enmienda para las normas y clasificaciones de semillas. Estos ajustes son necesarios para compensar el aumento en el costo de las pruebas y análisis de semillas debido a la inflación y los ajustes obligatorios en los salarios del personal. Los cambios propuestos también depuran los nombres y especies de malezas prohibidas y nocivas, y adoptan la Ley Federal de Semillas, Título 7 del Código de Reglamentos Federales (CFR), parte 201, para los métodos de muestreo y análisis, así como para las normas de germinación que depuran la reglamentación.

21.18.4.11 METHODS OF SAMPLING AND TESTING: The methods of sampling, inspecting, analyzing, testing, and examining agricultural and vegetable seed shall be the methods adopted by the Federal Seed Act 7 CFR Part 201. Methods of testing seeds for which the Federal Seed Act 7 CFR Part has not adopted methods of testing shall be determined by the state seed analyst or methods adopted by the association of official seed analysts.

21.18.4.12 TOLERANCES: Tolerances shall be the applicable tolerances established by the Federal Seed Act 7 CFR Part 201. In the case of prohibited noxious weed seeds, the tolerance shall be based on declaration of "none". In the case of vegetable seed in amounts of one pound or less not labeled as to actual germination, it will be intepreted that vegetable seeds must meet or exceed the minimum germination established by Section 10, germination standards for vegetable seeds.

Special testing requests not listed charged at the hourly rate.



repeal and replacement of the Seed Standards and
Classifications rule, Title 21, Chapter 18, Part 4 of
the New Mexico Administrative Code

My name is Les Owen, and I am deputy director with the New Mexico Department of Agriculture. Today I will be officiating this hearing. Please make sure that you have signed in for the record and that your cell phone is off or silenced. Thank you.

Copies of the proposed amendments to the Seed Standards and Classifications rule were made available in strikethrough version and in clean copy form as you walked in. If you require a copy, please hold up your hand and one will be provided to you.

The day and date is Thursday, July 31, 2025, and the time is 10 a.m. This hearing is being held in person at the Central New Mexico Community College Workforce Training Center in Albuquerque, New Mexico, 5600 Eagle Rock Avenue Northeast. This is the published date, time, and location for this hearing.

A transcript of today's hearing will be available from the department's webpage. Following a

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rule requires a repeal and replacement process to address updates to standard -- to style and format in conjunction with New Mexico Department of

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Agriculture's proposed amendments.

Primary proposed amendments to the Seed Standards and Classification rule include removing the table in Section 21.18.4.10, Germination Standards for Vegetable Seeds, and replacing with reference to the Federal Seed Act; updating Section 21.18.4.11, Methods of Sampling, to include reference to the Federal Seed Act and the Association of Official Seed Analyst; updating 21.18.4.13, Fee Schedules for Seed Testing, to help offset the increased cost of services due to inflation and mandatory adjustments to staff salary.

The last fee adjustment to Section 21.18.4.13, Fee Schedule for Seed Testing, was made in 1986. Proposed seed testing fee increases are for grass seed: complete test, \$20 to \$45; purity only, \$12 to \$24; germination only, \$12 to \$24; weed only, \$6 to \$16. For seed other than grass: complete test, \$10 to 25; purity only, \$6 to \$15; germination only, \$6 to \$15; weed only, \$6 to \$16; tetrazolium test for viability, \$20 to \$30; add vigor-cold test fee for 25 -- of \$25; and hourly charges for unusual samples from \$10 to \$45.

The expected budget revenue for updating 21.18.4.13 NMAC is approximately \$42,000 annually as opposed to the annual receipt of

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1	approximately \$21,000 under the current fee structure.
2	We compared the cost in five state laboratories
3	including Colorado, Idaho, Nevada, Texas, and Utah.
4	The proposed fees are still below the average of these
5	states, but provide budgetary assistance for the seed
6	laboratory operations.


