Minutes

All Items for Discussion and Possible Action

- The meeting started at 9:02
1. Call to Order and Roll Call- Commissioner Garcia was late, all other Commissioners were present-see roll call.
 2. Approval of Agenda: Commissioner Garcia joined at this point time 9:07. Commissioner Glass moved to approve the agenda. Commissioner Lucero seconded and the motion passed by all commissioners present- see roll call vote.
 3. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes (01/15/2026): Commissioner Sharp moved to approve the previous meeting minutes. Commissioner Glass seconded and the motion passed by all commissioners present, with Commissioner Lucero abstaining – see roll call vote.
 4. SWCC In Person Meetings (Commissioner Sharp): Commissioner Sharp presented a proposal to resume regular in-person meetings of the Commission to strengthen collaboration, improve communication among commissioners and districts, and enhance transparency. Discussion followed regarding the benefits of in-person engagement along with the need to retain teleconference and Zoom options to allow participation when travel is difficult. Commissioner Sharp moved to resume a regular schedule of in-person meetings with Zoom and teleconference options available, including scheduling meetings in conjunction with events and future workshops. Commissioner Garcia seconded and the motion passed by all commissioners present, with Commissioner Glass abstaining- see roll call vote.

5. SWCC Meetings dates for FY27 (Commissioner Sharp): Commissioner Sharp presented proposed meeting dates for FY27, including scheduling in-person meetings in conjunction with key events. Dates discussed included holding a meeting during the NMACD event in Albuquerque scheduled for October 19–21, 2026, an additional in-person meeting in September 2026, and a meeting during the legislative session in March 2027, along with future workshop opportunities. Commissioner Sharp moved to amend in person meetings and approve the proposed schedule of meetings. Commissioner Garcia seconded and the motion passed by all commissioners present with Commissioner Glass abstaining - see roll call vote
6. Open Meetings Resolution: Commissioner Glass moved to approve the Open Meetings Resolution. Commissioner Garcia seconded and the motion passed by all commissioners present - see roll call vote.

New Business

7. Public Comment (2 minutes per person): Teresa Smith de Cherif (Valencia SWCD Chair) provided comment regarding concerns related to the Valencia SWCD Rio Abajo Conservation Area property. She stated that misinformation has been circulated regarding the property and clarified that the land was donated for conservation purposes with no requirement to preserve existing structures. She referenced submitted documentation supporting the district's position and requested the Commission consider these facts. Tom Moraz (former Valencia County Commissioner) expressed opposition to the demolition of structures on the Valencia SWCD property, stating that the facilities could serve community benefit. He raised concerns regarding district decision-making, past expenditures, and mill levy practices, and urged the Commission to consider greater oversight and accountability. Antoinette Sedillo Lopez (Attorney for Valencia SWCD) provided legal clarification regarding the property and funding issues raised. She stated that the property was legally obtained for conservation purposes, that the structures are not required to be preserved, and noted safety and liability concerns with maintaining them. She also confirmed that the district's mill levy is lawful and appropriately continued due to existing financial obligations. Gail Goodman (Valencia SWCD

Supervisor) addressed concerns regarding her oath of office, stating she had been informed it was invalid and that she may not be allowed to participate in district meetings. She requested guidance and assistance regarding the validity of her oath and proper procedure.

8. SWCC Budget (Commissioner Sharp): Commissioner Sharp requested discussion to better understand the SWCC budget, including funding sources, allocations, and responsibilities. He noted the need for greater familiarity among commissioners and emphasized the importance of evaluating whether current funding is sufficient to support Commission activities, including potential in-person meetings and operational needs. Max Henkels (NMDA) presented explanation of current funding, including Commission operational funds and allocations associated with the point system and grant programs. Commissioners expressed interest in reviewing the budget in greater detail and identifying future needs. No action was taken. Item approved to be included as a topic for discussion at a future workshop/September meeting.
9. SWCC Workshop (Commissioner Sharp): Commissioner Sharp proposed holding a workshop to address Commission responsibilities, policy development, and operational priorities, emphasizing the need for a more focused and comprehensive discussion beyond regular meeting time. Discussion included combining the workshop with a regular Commission meeting to allow full participation and ensure compliance with open meeting requirements. Commissioners agreed that a workshop would provide an opportunity for more in-depth review of key topics. No formal motion was made. Consensus was reached to incorporate the workshop into a future meeting, anticipated for September.
10. Salado and Quemado SWCD: Notification of Contractor Non-Delivery – Land Use Plan, Catena Environmental LLC/Gabriella Coughlin: Representatives from Salado and Quemado SWCDs presented concerns regarding a contractor, Catena Environmental LLC (Gabriella Coughlin), related to non-delivery of a land use plan despite payments made. The districts reported that funds were issued under multiple invoices; however, no deliverables, draft plans, or supporting documentation have been received, and

communication with the contractor has been limited or unresponsive. Commissioners discussed the situation, including potential next steps and the challenges districts face in seeking resolution. Consideration was given to pursuing assistance through the Office of the Attorney General, as well as providing the contractor an opportunity to respond. No formal motion was made. Consensus was reached to revisit the item at a future meeting, anticipated for September, and to invite the contractor to present additional information.

11. Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) Supervisor Appointments: Commissioner Lopez moved to approve all supervisor appointments with the exception Ciudad: Gabriella Coughlin (6) to be tabled pending further information. Commissioner Sharp seconded and the motion passed by all commissioners; Commissioner chair Eddie Vigil and Commissioner Ross Garcia was not available for the vote- see roll call vote.

12. SWCD Mill Levy Resolutions: Commissioner Glass moved to approve the SWCD mill levy resolutions. Commissioner Lucero seconded and the motion passed by all commissioners present. Commissioner Ross Garcia was not available for the vote- see roll call vote.

13. Water Quality and Conservation FY27 Grant Recommendations/Funding (NMDA): Katie Mechenbier (NMDA) presented the Water Quality and Conservation grant recommendations for FY27. A total of 28 applications were received, with 16 projects recommended for funding, totaling \$156,273.36. The review committee noted strong interest in water monitoring projects and emphasized the importance of reporting results from those projects for future evaluation. Commissioner Glass moved to approve the grant funding recommendations as presented. Commissioner Sharp seconded and the motion passed by all commissioners present. Commissioner Ross Garcia was temporarily not available for the vote-- see roll call vote.
14. 2027 Point System Worksheet Potential Changes (NMDA): Kathryn Kruthaupt (NMDA) presented proposed changes to the FY27 Point System Worksheet, including revisions to compliance items, reporting requirements, and activity scoring to improve clarity and consistency. Discussion focused on board meeting requirements, audit compliance, and potential impacts to district funding. Commissioners expressed the need for additional

review prior to adoption. Commissioner Sharp moved to retain the FY26 Worksheet and to table consideration of the proposed FY2027 Point System Worksheet changes until a future workshop. Commissioner Glass seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously- see roll call vote.

15. 2028 Point System Worksheet Review/Potential Changes (NMDA): Max Henkels (NMDA) introduced the topic of future revisions to the 2028 Point System Worksheet and outlined the intent to conduct a more comprehensive review of the current point system. Discussion included evaluating existing policies, incorporating Commission input, and allowing districts the opportunity to participate in the revision process. No formal action was taken. The item was noted for further review and discussion at a future workshop.
16. SWCD training/requirements (Commissioner Sharp): Commissioner Sharp discussed the need for enhanced training and ongoing requirements for Soil and Water Conservation District supervisors and commissioners. He emphasized the importance of ensuring individuals understand their statutory responsibilities, compliance requirements, and governance roles. Discussion included the value of providing consistent training opportunities and the need for periodic updates to reinforce knowledge and address changing requirements. Commissioners noted the importance of making training accessible to all districts. Updates were provided indicating that the New Mexico Association of Conservation Districts (NMACD) has secured grant funding to support the development of a comprehensive training program for supervisors and staff. No formal action was taken.

Old Business

17. NMDA \$9 Million 3-Year Plan for SWCDs: Capacity-Building Funding Opportunity Update (NMDA): Max Henkels (NMDA) provided an update on the \$9 million three-year capacity-building funding plan for Soil and Water Conservation Districts. Discussion was held with the Commission regarding the status of remaining funds and distribution methods. It was agreed, with Commission support, that the remaining funds will be distributed through the established point system process.

18. Land of Enchantment Legacy Funding Update (NMDA): Max Henkels provided an update on the Land of Enchantment Legacy Funding program. He reported that funds continue to support district projects and capacity-building efforts, with NMDA providing oversight and technical assistance to ensure effective use and implementation. He noted continued engagement with districts and emphasized the importance of utilizing funds to address conservation priorities statewide.
19. Healthy Soil Program Update (NMDA): Katie Crayton and Dean Bruce (NMDA) reported that for FY27, 89 applications were received and 52 projects were funded, totaling approximately \$1.3 million. The program remains highly competitive and continues to support both producers and eligible entities statewide. Highlighted ongoing conservation planning training, noting that 12 SWCDs recently achieved Level 1 planner status, improving district capacity to assist with program participation. They also discussed research efforts through NMSU focusing on soil health and water conservation, along with upcoming outreach opportunities, including a Healthy Soil Conference in Albuquerque.

Reports/Verbal Highlights (5 min. each; written reports required 72 hours in advance)

20. Commissioners: Commissioner Glass (Region I): Commissioner Glass reported on several activities within Region I, including ongoing discussion regarding the Valencia SWCD Rio Abajo property and related marsh preservation efforts. He noted continued interest in watershed and conservation projects throughout the region. Commissioner Glass highlighted a regional meeting hosted by Cuba SWCD on June 11 and reported progress on watershed grant activities, including multiple applications under review. He also noted that San Juan SWCD recently hired new staff and continues work on a watershed planning initiative.

Commissioner Garcia (Region II): Commissioner Garcia provided brief regional updates and emphasized the importance of returning to in-person Commission meetings to strengthen communication, collaboration, and engagement among commissioners and districts.

Commissioner Lopez (Region IV): Commissioner Lopez provided brief regional updates and expressed support for continued efforts to strengthen district operations, governance, and supervisor training opportunities.

Commissioner Lucero (Region V): Commissioner Lucero reported on conservation activities occurring throughout Region V, including implementation of virtual fencing projects utilizing approximately 600 collars, Healthy Soil Program projects, equipment purchases, and seed distribution efforts. He also noted continuing concerns with drought conditions and water availability affecting agricultural producers within the region.

Commissioner Vigil (Region VI/Chair): Commissioner Vigil provided updates from the Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC), including ongoing deliberations and rulemaking activities related to surface water quality standards. He reported significant public participation in current proceedings and anticipated additional action later in the year.

Commissioner Sharp (At-Large): Commissioner Sharp reported on statewide conservation district priorities, including district compliance, supervisor and commissioner training, Commission budget awareness, policy development, and long-term capacity-building efforts. He emphasized the importance of continued support for districts through education, technical assistance, and future Commission workshops.

21. Governor's Office: none
22. New Mexico Department of Agriculture (NMDA): Max Henkels provided updates on NMDA programs and initiatives, including FY27 funding for district training and capacity-building efforts. He reported ongoing work on supervisor training resources, updates to the Noxious Weed Program, implementation of the Agricultural Workforce Development Program, and continued support for SWCD programs, grants, and conservation initiatives statewide.
23. Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS): none

27. Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC): Commissioner Chair Vigil provided an update on ongoing WQCC activities, including the surface water quality standards rulemaking process. He reported significant public participation and noted that deliberations on the proposed rule changes are expected later this year.
28. New Mexico Mining Commission: none
29. National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD): Josh Smith, Southwest Region Executive Board Member for NACD, reported that NACD continues to advocate for locally led conservation efforts and support conservation districts at the national level. He noted that federal budget reductions have limited available conservation funding, prompting NACD to pursue additional partnerships and funding opportunities. Mr. Smith also reported that NACD is working with new NRCS Chief Colton Buckley and emphasized the importance of passing the Farm Bill, encouraging stakeholders to contact their U.S. Senators in support of conservation funding.
30. New Mexico Association of Conservation Districts (NMACD): Jennifer Hopper provided updates on NMACD activities, including ongoing district visits, supervisor training efforts, and development of training resources to support district governance and compliance. She reported that NMACD has secured funding to expand supervisor and employee training opportunities and continues to work with NMDA and conservation districts to strengthen local capacity statewide.
31. New Mexico Coalition of Conservation Districts (NMCCD): none
32. NMSU College of Agriculture, Consumer and Environmental Sciences (ACES): none
33. New Mexico Conservation District Employees (NMCDE): Gerald Romero District Manager for the Tierra y Montes Soil and Water Conservation District and President of the New Mexico Conservation District Employees (NMCDE) reported that NMCDE held its annual meeting on April 23, 2026, in Moriarty, where officers were elected and bylaw amendments were approved. He stated that NMCDE looks forward to working closely with NMACD and NMDA on training opportunities for district employees and supervisors and supporting district capacity-building efforts across the state.
34. Next meeting: Commissioners discussed holding the next SWCC meeting as an in-person

meeting with workshop components in September 2026, while continuing to provide Zoom and teleconference participation options. The workshop is expected to include discussion of Commission responsibilities, budget review, point system revisions, district compliance assistance, and policy development. Specific date and location will be determined and announced at a later time.

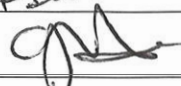

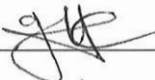
